What are the Medicare documentation requirements for physical and occupational therapy? Medicare reimburses therapists when the documentation and claim forms accurately report the provision of medically necessary covered services. So, in addition to being legible and relevant, documentation must

For reimbursement, the OIG says all outpatient physical therapy services must be “reasonable and necessary for the diagnosis and treatment of illness or injury or to improve the functioning of a malformed body member” A recommended reference for therapy services documentation requirements is Medicare Benefit Policy Manual, 100-2, chapter 15, sections 220 and 230.

The American Physical Therapy Association has written documentation guidelines that affect all PTAs. Many of these are basic, such as the rule that whatever the PTA did must be documented, dated and signed by the PTA who actually performed the treatment.

Skilled Physical Therapy Application of Guidelines Range of Motion: Only the qualified physical therapist may perform range of motion tests and, therefore, such tests are skilled physical therapy. Range of motion exercises constitute skilled physical therapy only if they are part of actual treatment for a specific disease state

Medicare Therapy Documentation in a Skilled Nursing Facility

The therapy treatment documentation must include the total number of minutes spent treating the patient for each modality or the beginning and end times of each treatment. At least eight minutes of therapy must be performed to charge for one unit of any of the time-based codes.

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
